What To Expect At Drive-In Church

- You can worship from the safety of your car! When you pull into the church parking lot you will be greeted by an usher who will help you park and will offer you a bulletin (or there will be a digital copy available on the website, 1stCongregational.Net). Tune into 89.7FM for the audio of the broadcast!
- If you would prefer to worship outside your car, you are welcome to bring your lawn chair and sit where you like. You will be expected to spread out, and if you plan on signing along with the hymns please leave at least 15' between your household and your neighbor. There will be "boombox" radios placed around the church property so that you can hear the radio broadcast.
- Kids! Attention families! There is an Activity Tent set up on the front lawn of the church. Kids (ages 6 and up) will be welcome during the worship service to come to the tent and do a craft. There are a few rules in the Activity Tent. 1) Kids need to wear a mask at all times. 2) They will be seated with their siblings or members from their household (kids or grandkids attending on their own will need a family member to come with them). 3) Supplies will not be shared between tables. We have two volunteers overseeing the Activity Tent. Our volunteers will be introducing the art project and helping kids social distance, but they will not be helping kids do their art. Sadly, nursery care will not be provided at this point.
- Please wear your mask when you are outside your car.
- Restrooms are available. Please sanitize your hands upon entering the building.
- We will be contract-tracing. Your attendance at worship services and mid-week gatherings going forward will be noted so that if someone in the congregation or someone having visited the building contracts the Coronavirus, you will be notified.
- Lastly, we will be streaming the service live to the church Facebook page and emailing out a YouTube link to the service in the Mid-Week News! If you are high-risk or feeling ill please stay home and take care of yourself and join us online for worship:)

I thank you all for being nimble in these creative and challenging times. It may be a while yet before we are able to reasonably gather inside the Meeting House for worship. Let's celebrate that worshiping outside allows us the space to sing and to gather in a variety of ways that respects people's comfort levels during the pandemic. All together in Christ,




GROOVE Dance is Back!

Matthew 15: 10-28

Scripture Reading

10 Then he called the crowd to him and said to them, "Listen and understand: 11 it is not what goes into the mouth that defiles a person, but it is what comes out of the mouth that defiles." 12 Then the disciples approached and said to him, "Do you know that the Pharisees took offense when they heard what you said?" 13 He answered, "Every plant that my heavenly Father has not planted will be

uprooted. 14 Let them alone; they are blind guides of the blind. And if one blind person guides another, both will fall into a pit." 15 But Peter said to him, "Explain this parable to us." 16 Then he said, "Are you also still without understanding? 17 Do you not see that whatever goes into the mouth enters the stomach, and goes out into the sewer? 18 But what comes out of the mouth proceeds from the heart, and this is what defiles. 19 For out of the heart come evil intentions, murder, adultery, fornication, theft, false witness, slander. 20 These are what defile a person, but to eat with unwashed hands does not defile."
